Current Priorities

- Exterior Exhibits: Continue to repair and upgrade exterior exhibits and accessibility; complete installation of mill race walking bridge to new site features; feature the newly restored Densmore Tank Car exhibit on 1860s oil transportation.
- **Exterior Signage:** Continue to replace the outdoor interpretive signs at Historic Pithole City; 24 signs produced by Pannier Graphics are ready for installation with another 24 in the design phase.
- **Return to Prepandemic Operations:** Continue to provide a safe learning environment and to encourage visitors to return to the site; visitation trajectory is on track from 67% of pre-COVID numbers in 2021–2022 to current fiscal 2022–2023 ending at about 90% of normal visitation numbers.

Signature Events

- **School Tours:** Standards-based, hands-on explorations of the birthplace of the petroleum industry led by professional educators and trained volunteers drew 750 students, teachers, and chaperones in the fall.
- **Wisdom and Wine Lecture Series:** Weekly series in March featured wine tastings and lectures from regional experts on oil and gas history and drew 173 participants over 4 evenings.
- **Historic Pithole City Lantern Tours:** A nighttime living history tour of the legendary oil boomtown drew 292 visitors in October.
